Library Enhancements

Our patrons have been enjoying the results of the Universal Access Project, which made flat, level sidewalks, an accessible front entryway, and a much larger parking lot. This project was made possible by an endowment from Richard P. Bauer and a New York State Construction Grant.

Last May the Library also completed a long overdue interior renovation, which included new paint, carpet, ceiling, and furniture. The new mobile book shelves certainly make life easier for us and allow us to offer larger programs to our community. What do you think of our updates?
